Preface: ENGLISH 12 IS A PROVINCIALLY EXAMINABLE COURSE

This course strengthens the development of literacy and communication as well as the critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a series of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures, as well as a range of informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms.

An important focus will be on using language with precision and clarity and incorporating stylistic devices appropriately and effectively. Students will also reflect individually on their own learning, experiences, and cultural connections in relation to their own skill building, topics being explored and literature that they engage in.

It is expected that over the course of the semester students will apply themselves to achieve a number of prescribed learning outcomes but also and more importantly, that they will complete all course material and assignments to the best of their ability. The course is intended to prepare students for the compulsory Grade 12 course.
