Course Description

In Social Studies, it is our hope that students learn more about themselves, each other, and the world in which we live. In this course, students will focus on developing critical thinking skills and come to know how Canada has been influenced by conflict, political decisions, ideology, societal changes, history, and geography. Students will be successful in this course when they can conduct effective inquiry and research, and demonstrate competency with the skills focused on in the new curriculum. Through their participation in Social Studies students are encouraged to:

- Understand their roles, rights, and responsibilities within Canada and the world
- Develop an appreciation for democracy and what it means to be Canadian
- Demonstrate respect for human equality and cultural diversity
- Think critically, evaluate information, and practice effective communication.

Course Overview

Social Studies 10 surveys Canada's development and role in the 20th century through 4 Big Ideas:

- Global and regional conflicts have been a powerful force in shaping our contemporary world and identities.
- The development of political institutions is influenced by economic, social, ideological, and geographic factors.
- Worldviews lead to different perspectives and ideas about developments in Canadian society.
- Historical and contemporary injustices challenge the narrative and identity of Canada as an inclusive, multicultural society.
