Course Rationale

The "Intermediate Speaking, Listening, and Vocabulary" course is designed for low-intermediate English Language Learner (ELL) students who seek to improve their verbal communication and comprehension skills in English. This course focuses on enhancing students' ability to participate confidently in conversations, comprehend spoken English in various contexts, and expand their vocabulary for more effective communication.

Students will engage in activities that build speaking fluency, such as structured dialogues, roleplays, and discussions on familiar topics. The listening component will emphasize understanding different accents, identifying key information, and responding appropriately in everyday situations. Through targeted listening exercises, students will develop the ability to follow conversations, instructions, and short presentations in English.

Vocabulary development will be integrated throughout the course, with a focus on practical, high-frequency words and phrases that students can immediately apply in real-life situations. Students will learn strategies for remembering and using new vocabulary, enhancing their ability to express themselves clearly and accurately.

By the end of the course, students will have strengthened their speaking and listening skills, enabling them to participate more fully in English-speaking environments and further their overall language development.
