Course Overview:

The goals of ELL Advanced, Reading, Writing and Grammar are to give students a foundation from which to have further success in secondary language arts studies. Our class is comprised of reading, writing and interpersonal communications both towards the class and in small groups. We will start the semester with an overview of English grammar tenses which will be helpful for class reading and writing assignments. Students will read the novella “Pirates of the Caribbean” and the full novel “Charlie and The Chocolate Factory”. From these stories we will cover essay writing and how to properly structure different types of essays. Our class will also cover a section on poetry and creating individual poems. For this section we will look at First Nations inspired “slam” poetry as a means to get inspiration and learn from Canada’s indigenous peoples.

Some of the skills encompassed:

- **Higher level grammar** leading to more complex language interactions.
- **Developing Reading skills** such as skimming, scanning, contextualising as well as summarizing.
- **Expanding Vocabulary** through word banks, synonyms, antonyms, expressions and modern slang.
- **Writing Strategies:** essay construction, draft writing, paragraph constructions and paraphrasing.

Now, let's talk about our class expectations!

There is a full list on the class website, which I expect all of you to read thoroughly!

Here's what you need to know:

1. Come on time! If you are more than 15 minutes late, you will be marked absent!
2. If you are late for more than three classes, you will be asked to stay after class for fifteen minutes. So if you want to be somewhere with your friends after class, don't come complaining to me. Just be on time!

6. Plagiarism is not tolerated under any circumstance. If you copy from your classmates, your assignment/exam will be cancelled, and you will be given a 0.
7. Attendance is important! If you are sick, please send me an email. If you are missing a class for another reason, please come talk to me in advance. Serious illnesses which cause you to miss more than two classes will require a doctor's note.
