## **Course Description:**

Media Arts 10 & 12 is designed for students to develop, explore and create media art using sensory inspiration, imagination and inquiry based learning. Students will learn to Explore and Create through creating innovative media artworks and film production, fostering and demonstrating the elements and principles of film and media design and image development strategies, knowledge of media technologies and standards-compliant technology, sensory inspiration and other sources of inspiration, creative risks, innovative media artworks for a specific audience and resolving creative challenges. Reason and Reflect, through film analysis and mise-en-scene, discovering and displaying an understanding of the influences of visual culture in media arts and developing strong critical thinking, research and analytical skills via creation, exploration and analysis of a variety of image sources and genres. Enabling them to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of terminology used in media art. Communicate and Document through narrative storytelling, scriptwriting, developing and planning in prep and pre-production and production documents, developing, utilizing and demonstrating a range of media and filmmaking materials, processes and techniques and communicating, expressing an appreciation of media artworks in a variety of contexts. Connect and Expand through creation, production, completion and exhibition of a media artwork and/or film product, developing, enhancing and mastering media production skills to enhance, alter or shape technical elements of a project through the filmmaking process/stages of pre-production, production and post-production. Incorporating use of symbols and metaphors and demonstrating social responsibility associated with creating, perceiving and responding to media art, reflecting personal voice, story and values, connect with others on a local, national or global scale through media arts and demonstrate safe and responsible use of materials, tools and work space. Demonstrating familiarity and acknowledgement of health and safety protocols and procedures, ethical, moral and legal considerations associated with media arts and moral rights, ethics of cultural appropriation and plagiarism.

**Media Arts**: unique art forms that employ film, video, new media, and sound as a means of artistic expression.

**Aesthetic experiences**: emotional, cognitive, or sensory responses to works of art.

Students will explore a variety of film and digital media contexts, styles, genres, elements, aesthetics and techniques. Including the Stages of Filmmaking: Development Process, Film interpretation and film analysis through mise-en-scene and film and media terminology. Through this study, students will review, interpret and analyse film and media techniques, key elements of mise-en-scene: Setting, Props, Costume, Performance, Lighting, Cinematography, Sound (diegetic and non-diegetic), Editing and film and media artworks using visual literacy and develop strong and critical analytical, creative, written and organisational skills.

Students will develop their imaginative abilities, hone their writing and managerial skills and cultivate a deeper appreciation for the power of digital storytelling. Students will explore various genres of film and media arts, pitch, storyboard, and script their narrative ideas and delve into the fundamentals required for the <b>Pre-Production Stage/Phase of Filmmaking</b> . They will develop critical thinking skills to evaluate films and digital media artworks, identify bias, and explore cultural influences and ethical considerations in film and media creation. in film. They will learn the elements, documents, departments, team/crew roles and all other moving pieces involved to prepare, plan and make a collaborative and successful film production and/or media artwork. They will learn to "fix it in prep!" (not set or post) before moving into the next stage/phase of filmmaking.

During this unit, students will continue to explore and hone their creativity, time management. people management, organisational skills and develop strong production and collaboration skills required for film and media creation. Moving into the essential **Filmmaking** crucial and Stage/Phase of Production, they will learn about the techniques required and used to create, shoot and make a film and media artwork. They will develop essential collaborative, critical thinking, production management, problem-solving and technical skills. They will gain knowledge and understanding to be able to identify and be familiar with all the moving pieces: elements, documents, departments, on set roles, directing, producing and managing a team of creatives, involved with film and media production, getting footage in the can and creating a final product to share with audiences.

In this this unit, students will be introduced to and develop the basic knowledge and skills of editing during one of the final Stages/Phases Filmmaking of **Production**. Students will gain knowledge, understanding and practice of technical storytelling and design skills and techniques required and used for audio visual editing including basic sound design and rough cut and assembly edit of their own short film and media artworks. They will discover the crucial role that post production plays in delivering a polished and successful final product to share with their target audience while keeping into consideration the cultural and ethical messages that will be portrayed through their story and the digital footprint they will make with what they are outputting into the world.
