Course Description:

Composition 10 is designed to support students in their development and demonstration of critical thinking, research skills, and the ability to use evidence and persuasive appeals effectively to convince an audience. In this course, students will be introduced to, explore and analyse various writing types and styles in English Composition: Creative Writing (Descriptive/Narrative), Persuasive Writing, Opinion Writing, Expository/Feature Article Writing, and Essay Writing. Students will create both individual and collective original writing pieces and collaborative projects through the process of drafting, sharing, reflecting, revising, polishing and rewriting.

UNIT	BIG IDEA (S)	UNIT DESCRIPTION
Intro to Writing 101	 The exploration of text and story deepens the understanding of one's identity, others, and the world. Engagement with writing processes can support creativity and enhance clarity of expression. 	This unit introduces students to the fundamental writing types, writing styles, and writing processes. Students will explore and get a taster of a variety of writing styles, elements, formats and structures. Including Creative Writing: Descriptive and Narrative, Persuasive Writing, Opinion Writing, Expository/Feature Article Writing, and Essay Writing. Through this study, students will review, analyse and practice writing paragraphs using literary devices and develop critical reading skills.
Creative Writing 101	 Engagement with writing processes can support creativity and enhance clarity of expression Texts are socially, culturally, geographically, and historically constructed. 	This unit explores creativity and students will develop their imaginative abilities, hone their writing skills and cultivate a deeper appreciation for the power of storytelling. Students will explore various genres of creative writing including Descriptive Writing: sensory details, visual imagery, strong and powerful word choices and poetry, Narrative Writing: short stories, character development and the three act structure. They will learn how to craft compelling characters, develop vivid

Persuasive Writing 101	 Questioning what we hear, read, and view contributes to our ability to be educated and engaged citizens. Engagement with writing processes can support creativity and enhance clarity of expression Language shapes ideas and influences others. 	During this unit, students will explore persuasive writing, the psychology of advertising and marketing and its impact on consumer behavior and society. They will learn about the techniques used to pitch and market ideas/products, and ethical considerations in print and media creation. They will develop critical thinking skills to evaluate advertisements, identify bias, explore Maslow's hierarchy of needs and assess the influence of social media on culture and identity.
Expository Writing 101	 Engagement with writing processes can support creativity and enhance clarity of expression Language shapes ideas and influences others. Questioning what we hear, read, and view contributes to our ability to be educated and engaged citizens. 	For this unit, students will develop their ability to articulate and explain their ideas with clarity and precision. Through various prompts and exercises, they will construct structured essays that include thesis statements supported by concrete examples and logical arguments that analyse information and informs readers on a topic.

Assessment
