Course Description:

The goals of English 9 is to give students a foundation from which to have further success in secondary language arts studies. Our class is comprised of reading, writing and interpersonal communications both towards the class and in small groups. Students will work on exercises and activities that provide experience in English writing and speaking to improve their overall production of language. They also focus on receptive skills of listening and reading. This class will further provide intensive vocabulary development which seeks to make learning vocabulary fun and help students develop studying tactics.

Course Overview:

- Forming opinions in speaking and writing
- Materials in the form of videos and podcasts to improve overall listening comprehension
- Language techniques for self-expression in both speaking and writing.
